
Anatomy of Researcher

Guidelines for visual:

- First and last name included on front
- Hand drawn or digital (must print digital assignments to submit)
- · Body outline provided is not required
- Colorful
- Neat
- Include at least 2 symbols per body part unless otherwise noted

- Predominantly image-based
- Size: from 8.5 x 11 in. to 11 x 17 no posters, please
- No major text
- Other metaphors allowed but not required no reproductive anatomy, please

Guidelines for writing:

- At least 500 words
- Professional, clean font (Times New Roman is not required, but a similar font is recommended)
- 1 inch margins
- Heading:

 First and Last Name
 Date
 Class Period
- · Grammatically correct
- Well-organized
- Engaging

- Avoid sentences such as "I chose to include a picture of my dog because he is always there to make me feel better when I have a tough day." A better sentence would be "My lifelong best friend, my dog greets me with the happiest tail wags when I get home – erasing any evidence of a tough day." The second type of sentence allows you to vary your sentences and word choice.
- Reasoning for symbol choices is wellestablished using specific evidence
